PNZ sets public hearing for Decorah residential

zoning changes

Proposals harken back to historic smaller lots

For a few years, Decorah's Planning & Zoning Committee has intermittently discussed the reviewing of regulations regarding zoning and the removal of barriers from more dense residential development. Now the discussions have become actionable, as P&Z has updated existing residential zoning language and made proposed changes voiced by previous meetings and conversations.

R-1 Single-Family Residential District

As a result of these tentative changes, the R-1 Single-Family Residential District lot area will reduce from 15,000 to 10,000 sq. ft., lot width will decrease from 120 to 90 feet, and front yard will be reduced from 35 to 30 feet. Side yard minimums will be 8

feet instead of 12, with churches and schools stricken from this section. Accessory building maximum height will increase from 12 to 25 feet measured to the peak of the roofline from grade, and no entry door shall be taller than 9ft. Accessory buildings will be limited to two stories maximum.

R-2 Single- to Four-Family **Residential District**

In R-2 Single- to Four-Family Residential District, lot area for single-family and two-family dwellings would decrease from 10,000 to 8,000 square feet, three-family dwelling would decrease from 12,000 to 9,500 sq. ft., and four-family dwelling would decrease from 13,200 to 10,500

Lot width for single-family dwelling would decrease from 80 to 60 feet, two-family dwell-

ing would decrease from 90 to 60 feet, three-family dwelling would decrease from 100 to 80 feet, and four-family dwelling lot width would decrease from 110 to 80

Front yard would decrease from 35 to 30 feet, and colleges would be stricken. Side yard minimums would decrease from 10 to 8 feet, and colleges, churches and schools would be stricken. Rear yard specs would remain the same, but colleges would be stricken. Accessory building maximum height will increase from 12 to 25 feet measured to the peak of the roofline from grade, and no entry door shall be taller than 9 feet. Accessory buildings will be limited to two stories maximum.

R-3 Multiple-Family **Residential District**

In R-3 Multiple-Family Resi-

dential District, lot area for single-family dwelling would decrease from 8,000 to 6,000 sq. ft. and two-family dwelling would decrease from 10,000 to 7,500 sq. ft. Lot width for a single-family dwelling would decrease from 60 to 50 feet, two-family dwelling would decrease from 70 to 50 feet, and multiple-family dwelling and other permitted uses would decrease from 80 to 60 feet. Front yard would decrease from 25 to 20 feet. Accessory building maximum height will increase from 12 to 25 feet measured to the peak of the roofline from grade, and no entry door shall be taller than 9 feet. Accessory buildings will be limited to two stories maximum.

The public hearing to discuss these changes will be held at 5:30 p.m. Monday, Feb. 13, at Decorah City Hall as part of P&Z's month-
